Major Scams and Red Flags to Avoid

1. "ICAR Approved" Claims

Many colleges advertise:

"ICAR approved"

Check whether the college is actually affiliated to a recognized university and whether the programme has ICAR accreditation where applicable.

2. Fake Placement Claims

Be suspicious of:

- "100% placement"
- "Guaranteed government job"

No college can guarantee a government job.

3. Unrecognized Food Technology Programs

Verify:

- AICTE approval (where applicable)
- UGC recognition
- University status

4. Tiny Private Colleges

Common issues:

- No laboratories
- No pilot food processing plant
- No research farms
- No industry internships

5. Poor Internship Exposure

In agriculture and food technology, internships often determine employability more than grades.

6. Distance Learning Agriculture Degrees

Avoid undergraduate agriculture degrees offered through questionable distance-learning models. Many employers and higher education pathways prefer recognized regular programmes.
