Food Technologists work at the intersection of food science, engineering, and public health — developing new food products, ensuring food safety, managing quality control in food processing plants, working with FSSAI (India's food regulator), and conducting R&D; for FMCG companies.

This is a NON-HOSPITAL paramedical career but ranked here because of its strong public health component and government career options.

Qualification: B.Tech Food Technology (4 years) — stronger than B.Sc. for industry roles. B.Sc. Food Technology (3 years) — more affordable, good for government research pathways.

ELIGIBILITY

- B.Tech: 10+2 PCM/PCB minimum 50-60%; JEE Main score required for top NIT/CFTI options.
- B.Sc.: 10+2 PCB/PCM minimum 45-50%.
- JEE Main not required for most private B.Tech colleges.

ADMISSION TIMING

- B.Tech: JEE Main registration January-February; results April; JoSAA counselling June-July.
- B.Sc. (state universities): April-August.
- CUET for central university B.Sc. programmes: March-June.

- FSSAI 'coaching institutes' guaranteeing government jobs — FSSAI exam is competitive; coaching can help but no guarantee is possible or legal.

■ Private B.Tech colleges without functional food processing labs (pilot plant) — visit the lab before admission; a proper B.Tech needs a mini food factory.

■ Fake CFTRI admission agents — CFTRI admits only through CUET portal (cuet.samarth.ac.in). No agents involved.

■ Unrecognised 'Food Technology Diploma' mills offering 3-6 month courses claiming equivalence to degree — not valid.

■ Online 'HACCP/ISO certification' factories — verify any food safety certification through the certifying body directly.
